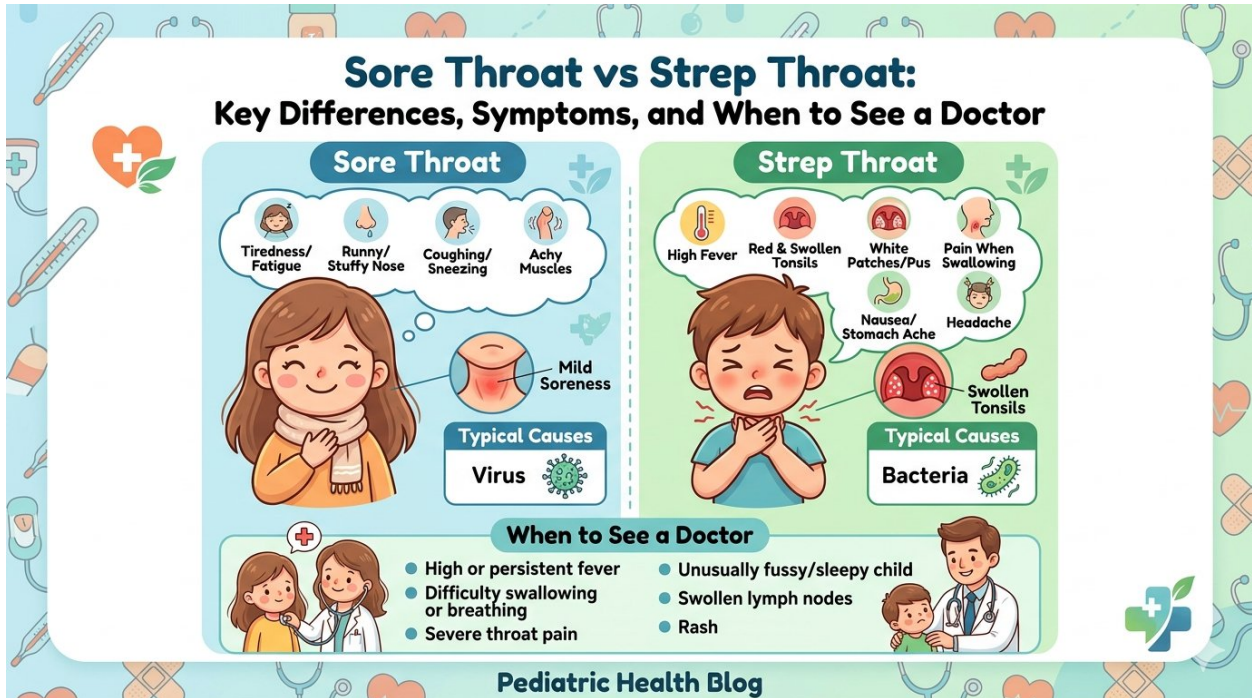


# Sore Throat vs Strep Throat: Key Differences, Symptoms, and When to See a Doctor

## What is Strep Throat?

As it is a bacterial infection, strep throat needs a medical diagnosis and an antibiotic treatment to prevent health complications.

## Key Differences Between Sore Throat and Strep Throat

The symptoms may seem similar, but there are some very important differences:

- **Sore throat (viral):** Often includes cough, runny nose, and mild discomfort
- **Strep throat:** Sudden severe pain, high fever, swollen lymph nodes, and white patches on tonsils

Another important difference is that viral infections rarely cause any high fever or pus on the tonsils, which are very commonly seen in strep throat.

### **Symptoms Parents Must Watch Out for?**

Parents must pay close attention to some warning signs, such as:

- Difficulty swallowing
- High fever
- Swollen glands
- White spots or redness in the throat
- Absence of cold symptoms like cough or runny nose

### **When Should You See a Doctor?**

- Symptoms persist for more than a few days
- Fever is high or stays for a while continuously
- The child has difficulty breathing or swallowing
- There are visible white patches in the throat
